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# Highlights of Union Budget 2023-24

A write-up on Income Tax for pensioners as per the proposals in the Union Budget for 2023-2024 by Sri T.N.C. Sridhar, Joint Commissioner of Income Tax (Retd), Member Regional Direct Taxes Advisory Committee of Government of India, Advocate and Taxation Counsel is reproduced below.



In the present budget 2023, certain amendments have been proposed relating to new tax regime under Section 115 BAC. This has raised a lot of interest and dilemma whether one should remain in old tax regime or migrate to new regime.

Tax structure of cooperative societies, firms, local bodies and corporates are not

discussed in this article. This article is focused on pensioners having pension income and those pensioners having income other than pension.

This budget indicates moving towards no exemption, incentives, deductions and setoff and carry forward of losses.

This budget focuses on putting more money in the hands of people to spend rather

than saving to save taxes, consequently more money in circulation rather than being blocked. Of course after taxation money can be prudently invested for providence.

#### Salient features

- There is no change of rate structure in old regime.
- New regime has been now extended to all persons.
- Standard deduction u/s 16(1) upto 50,000/ available.
- Deduction on, contributions to pension fund u/s 80CCD available.
- Inter regime migration between old and new regimes every year available to all except persons having income from Business and/or profession, who are allowed inter regime migration only once in lifetime.
- 6. By default all will be under old regime unless opted to migrate to new regime to be exercised before due date of filing return. But Finance Minister, while explaining in parliament, has said the other way round that New Regime is by default if not opted for old regime. Hence this issue of 'default' needs to be set at rest when the Act is passed.
- Benefit of age is not available in new regime. No different rates for senior and very senior persons.
- New regime generally does not give benefit of exemptions, interest on housing loan, incentive, and general deductions and carry forward and set off of losses.

# Notional Increment to those pensioners who retired on 30th June/31st December

Central Administrative Tribunal, Ernakulam Bench, vide its order dated 1-11-2022 in OANo.180/00687/2019 & 15 others dismissed 16 OAs filed by the applicants praying for grant of notional increment as they had retired on 30th June / 31st December.

The Tribunal vide Para 25 and 31of its order has stated as follows.

25. Applying the above legal position with respect to Rule 10 of the CCS (RP) Rules,

2016 and with reference to the law regarding the date of retirement of an employee, it is evident that an employee who retires on the last working day of a month previous to 1st January or 1st July as the case may be, ceases to be a Government employee on the 1st of January or 1st July as the case may be and is not entitled for the increment.

31. Necessarily all the OAs have to fail. They are accordingly, dismissed. No costs.

# Revised Ward entitlement for those CGHS beneficiaries who retired on or after 01.01.2016

Sir

I am directed to refer your letter dated 11.01.2023 on the subject cited above and to say that post 7th CPC, ward entitlement was revised vide MoHPW OM dated 09.01.2017 and was made effective w.e.f. 01.02.2017 vide OM no 13.01.2017. This means that all CGHS beneficiaries were paying subscription at the old rates for the period from 01.01.2016 to 31.01.2017 and also their ward entitlement was as per 6th CPC. Therefore there is no question of revision of ward entitlement of beneficiaries for the said period.

2. Vide OM dated 28.10.2022 ward entitlement of beneficiaries have been revised with the

approval of D/o Expenditure in order to rectify the anomaly that had occurred post 7th CPC and as notified vide OM dated 09.01.2017. Therefore, all CGHS beneficiaries (serving and retired) whose ward entitlement underwent down gradation from 01.02.2017 onwards are entitled for ward up gradation as per OM dated 28.10.2022 subject to the condition that Medical Claim cases of beneficiaries will not be reopened with regard to their ward entitlement for the treatment, if any, availed by them during the period 01.02.2017 to 28.10.2022.

3. This issues with the approval of the competent Authority.

Extension of date for submission of Acceptance letters for terms and conditions of revised MoA by already empanelled hospitals under CGHS and the validity of empanelment till 30th April 2023 or till finalization of new rates whichever is earlier.

With reference to the above mentioned subject, the undersigned is directed to draw the attention to the OM No S-11011/09/2022/CGHS (HEC) dated 13th September 2022, 14th October 2022 and 29th December 2022 vide which orders were issued for submission by the HCOs already empanelled under CGHS of acceptance letter for the terms and conditions of revised MoA by 28th Februar 2023 to the concerned Additional Director, CGHS. Since then this Ministry is in receipt of representations from various quarters for extension of time, the matter has been reviewed by the Ministry, it has been now decided that the validity of empanelment of CGHS empanelled HCOs, as

per the existing terms and conditions of empanelment, has been extended till 30th April 2023 or till finalization of new rates, whichever is earlier.

It has also been decided that the date for submission of the acceptance letter and revised MoA has been extended till 30th April 2023.

The Additional Directors, CGHS are advised to bring the contents of this letter to the notice of all empanelled HCOs

# Instructions to all CGHS Wellness Centres and Units to follow CGHS guidelines issued from time to time.

With reference to the above subject the undersigned is directed to state that CMOs in charge and other Medical Officers and staff of all CGHS Wellness Centres and the staff working at the administrative offices of CGHS shall keep themselves updated with the guidelines / orders issued under CGHS and implement the same in discharging their duties. In this regard it is reiterated that special attention may be paid for the following issues:

- Punctuality in attendance Additional Directors shall monitor the Aadhar based Bio-metric attendance system and take necessary action.
- II) Self printed CGHS card is valid for all CGHS facilities and is valid in any CGHS Wellness Centre in the Country, even if, the card is registered with a Wellness Centre, where the card holder is residing. This applies to issues of medicines, referral and endorsement of referral.
- III) CGHS beneficiaries may be issued medicines for treatment of chronic illnesses by medical Officers of CGHS for three months (including Indents) from any Wellness Centre. In case of treatment of Chronic illnesses, all CGHS Medical Officers are competent to provide followup treatment after advice by Specialists and Medical Officers of CGHS can issue same medicines to beneficiaries prescribed by the Specialists even after the expiry of the validity of the prescription in Chronic diseases, where the clinical condition is stable and CGHS shall not insist on immediate revalidation by Specialists the period for which the prescription has been issued. Only in such cases, wherein there is a need for modification of the diagnosis and/or modification of the line of treatment,

beneficiaries should be referred to the concerned specialist.

However, in cases of Chemotherapy medicines and immunosuppressant treatment regular follow up from Specialists would be advisable and medicines may be repeated upto seven days only awaiting the review by Specialists.

- v) CMO In charge shall scrutinize indents placed by Medical Officers before, finalizing the indent for sending to Authorized Local Chemists.
- vi) CMOs In charge shall keep themselves updated with the medicines stock of medicines supplied by MSO and to take steps to replenish the Stock at Wellness Centres to minimize the Indents to ALCs.
- vii) All medical Officers shall be provided necessary items like Torch, Stethoscope, BP Apparatus etc., and shall record Blood Pressure as and when required; they shall also give Injections, if any, when Nursing Officers is not available.
- viii) If any beneficiary is in need of urgent consultation, after registration is closed, Medical Officers have the option to examine the patient- When , a Medical Officer enters the Ben ID No in the prescription module , the system shall automatically generate the Serial Number for Registration.
- vii) Additional Directors/ CMOs in charge shall monitor the number /Quantum of medicines procured through 'JanaAushadhi Pariyojana' regarding the number / Quantity indented / supplied and take necessary corrective steps wherever possible to ensure availability of buffer stock of medicines obtained through Janaushadhi for two months

These guidelines are in supersession of the guidelines issued earlier on the subject.

This is the best period in life when we get assured money for doing nothing. That pension is deferred pay is only a lame claim to substantiate it. Whatever let it be. The full time at our disposal could be utilised to ponder over the meaning and purpose of life, the creation and creator and to show sympathy and help to lesser privileged among us who are legion and contribute our mite to the deserving. It is not a charity but a duty to society in which all members are interdependent. After all, we cannot carry even one paisa with us when we exit. This is only an investment for our own future good, here as well as hereafter. I have not said anything new or unknown to you, but only brought to the surface of your memory what is hidden under layers of worries.

Conclusion:- Less interference by self, more freedom to the children, make retired life a modern day VANAPRASTHA ASHRAMA for the welfare of the family and the society

Answer: In the event of death of a pensioner, either the spouse or other member of the family who is eligible for the grant of family pension, must intimate the Pension Disbursing Authority (Head Post office/ Bank concerned) about the death of the pensioner and submit a copy of the death certificate of the pensioner. The PDA/ Head of Office will initiate further action as required by Rule 79 of CCS (Pension) Rules 2021 reproduced below.

- 79: Sanction of family pension and residuary gratuity on the death or disappearance of a pensioner or family pensioner:--
- (1) Where the Head of Office has received an intimation or information regarding the death or disappearance of a pensioner or death or disappearance or ineligibility of a family pensioner, he shall ascertain whether any family pension or residuary gratuity or both in respect of the deceased pensioner or any family pension

in respect of the missing pensioner or any family pension in respect of the deceased or missing family pensioner are payable and proceed as hereinafter provided.

- (2)(a)(i) In the case of death of a pensioner, if the deceased pensioner is survived by a widow or widower who is eligible for the grant of family pension under rule 50, the amount of family pension as indicated in the Pension Payment Order shall become payable to the widow or widower, as the case may be, from the date following the date of death of the pensioner.
- (ii) The Pension Disbursing Authority shall commence disbursement of family pension, as authorised in the Pension Payment Order, to the widow or widower, whose name has been included in the Pension Payment Order, within one month of the receipt of a claim in Form 12 from the widow or widower along with a copy of the death certificate and an undertaking to the Bank in Format 9.

(Rules regarding payment of family pension to the other eligible members of the family: in the next or subsequent issues of the journal).
